Notes on Today's Music

When morning gilds the skies was translated by Edward Caswell (1814-1878) from an anonymous German text, "Beim frühen Morgenlicht," thought to date from around 1800 (perhaps even the mid-1700s). The German text was first published in Sebastian Portner's *Katholisches Gesangbuch* (1828). Caswell was ordained in the Church of England, but after the death of his wife he joined the Roman Catholic Church and lived with John Henry Newman at the Oratory in Birmingham. The words were reworked by Robert Seymour Bridges (1844-1930), England's poet laureate (1913) and friend of Gerald Manley Hopkins, whose works he arranged to have published posthumously.

The images of the rising sun carry over to the second stanza as the "night becomes as day" and the "powers of darkness fear." However, stanzas three and four switch from visual images of light to aural images "joyous with the sound" of praising Christ.


The tune LAUDES DOMINI was composed for this text by Joseph Barnaby (1839-1896), English organist and composer. The rising melodic motif complements the rising sun that "gilds the skies" of the early morning. Within two phrases we soar an octave above our starting pitch - indeed our voices ascend with the rising sun about which we are singing. The melody ends on an unusually high note for hymns, proclaiming the text, "May Jesus Christ be praised!" These five words form a brief refrain that encapsulates the intent of the entire hymn.

Draw us in the Spirit's tether was written by Anglican Percy Dearmer (1867-1936). Objections have been raised to its seemingly low Eucharistic theology, but it has been used at papal ceremonies, and the melody is lovely. Jesus has promised that he will be present when we gather in His name, and indeed the purpose of our receiving Him in the Eucharist is to become one body with Him, and our love and service is sign to the world of His presence. The hymn begins in the Upper Room with the disciples and comes full circle as we join them and the Christians of every age around the table and are nourished to serve others in the world.

The hymn is an adaptation of an anthem by Harold Friedell (1905-1958), organist and choirmaster at St. Bartholomew's in New York.

Rise up, o men of God was written in 1911 by the Presbyterian pastor William P. Merrill (1867-1954) to support the men's movement in the church. Churches were aware of the lack of men in their congregations. The Men and Religion Forward Movement called men to discipleship so that they could help implement Christian principles in public life. It challenged men to take up the work of transforming the world in Christ.

The tune FESTAL SONG is by William Henry Walter (1825-1893). He was organist at Trinity Chapel, Columbia University.

THE ORDER of HOLY BAPTISM for INFANTS

Celebrant *to the Parents and Godparents*

What do you desire of God's holy Church?

They answer: Baptism.

Will you take care, to the best of your ability, that this child be brought up as a faithful member of Christ's holy Church?

They answer: I will.

Let us pray:

Almighty and immortal God, the aid of all who need, the helper of all who flee to thee for succor, the life of those who believe, and the resurrection of the dead, we call upon thee for this child, that he, coming to thy holy Baptism, may receive remission of sin by spiritual regeneration, and being received into thy holy Church, may live steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity. Receive him, O Lord, as thou hast promised by thy well-beloved Son, saying, Ask, and ye shall have; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. So give now unto us who ask; let us who seek, find; open the gate unto us who knock; that this child may enjoy the everlasting benediction of thy heavenly washing, and may come to the eternal kingdom which thou hast promised by Christ our Lord. *All answer: Amen.*

WE RECEIVE this child into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign her with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter she shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and valiantly to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue as Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto her life's end. *Amen.*

The Celebrant places a few grains of salt in the child's mouth:

Receive the salt of wisdom: may it be unto thee a pledge of everlasting life. *Amen.*

The Celebrant and the people pray together:

ALMIGHTY AND everlasting God, heavenly Father, we give thee humble thanks, that thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of thy grace, and faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give the Holy Spirit to this child, that she may be born again, and be made an heir of everlasting salvation; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the same Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

THE PROMISES

The Celebrant addresses the parents and godparents:

Dearly beloved, you have brought this child here to receive holy Baptism; you have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ would vouchsafe to receive him, to release him from sin, to sanctify him with the Holy Spirit, to give him the kingdom of heaven, and everlasting life.

Do you therefore, in the name of this child, renounce the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires of the same, and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that thou wilt not follow, nor be led by them?

They answer: I renounce them all; and, by God's help, will endeavor not to follow, nor be led by them.

The Celebrant here anoints the child with the Oil of the Catechumens, saying:

I anoint thee with the oil of Salvation, in Christ Jesus our Lord, that thou mayest have eternal life.

The Celebrant again addresses the parents and godparents:

Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth?

They answer: I do.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived of the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead?

They answer: I do.

Do you believe the Holy Ghost; the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?

They answer: I do.

Then shall the Celebrant say to the godparents:

Do you, in the name of this child, profess this faith?

They answer: I do.

Do you, in the name of this child, seek Baptism in this faith?

They answer: I do.

Do you, in the name of this child, acknowledge the duty to keep God's holy will and commandments, walking steadfastly in the Way of Christ?

They answer: I do.

Do you resolve to pray for this child, and take care that he may learn and do all these things?

They answer: I do.

Then shall the Celebrant make the following supplications, and after each the people shall answer Amen:

O merciful God, grant that the old Adam in this child may be so buried, that the new man may be raised up.
Amen.

O Lord of Hosts, before the might of whose presence the armies of evil are put to flight, deliver thy servant from the power of Satan. **Amen.**

Grant that all sinful desires may die in this child, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in him. **Amen.**

Grant that she may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph against the devil, the world, and the flesh. **Amen.**

Grant that whosoever is here dedicated to thee by our office and ministry may be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through thy mercy, O blessed Lord God, who dost live, and govern all things, world without end. **Amen.**

THE BLESSING OF THE WATER

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord our God.

It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of sins, did shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach all nations, and baptize them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Regard, we beseech thee, O Lord, Holy Father, with thy Beloved Son, the supplications of thy congregation, and send the Holy Spirit upon the water of this font.

Sanctify ✠ this Water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that this child, now to be baptized therein, may receive the fullness of thy grace, and ever remain in the number of thy faithful children; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and evermore. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Then shall the Celebrant say to the godparents:

Name this child.

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father ✠, and of the Son ✠, and of the Holy Spirit ✠.

Then shall the Celebrant anoint the baptized on the crown of the head with holy chrism:

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath regenerated thee by Water and the Holy Spirit, and hath given unto thee remission of sin, vouchsafe to anoint thee with the unction of his Holy Spirit, and bring thee to the inheritance of everlasting life. **Amen.**

Here shall the Celebrant place upon the child a white vesture:

We give this white vesture, for a token of the innocency bestowed upon thee, and for a sign whereby thou art admonished to give thyself to pureness of living, that after this transitory life, thou mayest be a partaker of the life everlasting. **Amen.**

Then shall the Celebrant give a candle lit from the Paschal Candle to one of the godparents:

Receive the Light of Christ, that when the bridegroom cometh thou mayest go forth with all the Saints to meet him; and see that thou keep the grace of thy Baptism. **Amen.**

Seeing now, dearly beloved brethren, that this child is regenerate, and grafted into the body of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that this child may lead the rest of her life according to this beginning.

Then shall the Celebrant say this prayer of thanksgiving:

WE YIELD thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate this child with thy Holy Spirit, to receive him for thine own by adoption, and to incorporate him into thy holy Church. Grant, O Lord, that being buried with Christ by Baptism and made partaker of his death, he may also be made partaker of his resurrection; so that serving thee here in newness of life, he may finally, with the rest of thy holy Church, inherit thine everlasting kingdom; through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The faithful now return to their places, and the Mass continues with the Prayers of the People.

Priest Let us offer our prayers to Almighty God.

Father, we pray for thy holy Catholic Church;

People **That we all may be one.**

Priest Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve thee;

People **That thy Name may be glorified by all people.**

and for all bishops, priests, and deacons;

People **That they may be faithful ministers of thy Word and Sacraments.**

Priest We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

People **That they may work for thy peace on earth.**

Priest Give us grace to do thy will in all that we undertake;

People **That our works may find favor in thy sight.**

Priest Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble;

People **That they may be delivered from their distress.**

Priest Give to all the departed eternal rest;

People **And let light perpetual shine upon them.**

Priest We praise thee for the Blessed Virgin Mary, and for all thy saints who have entered into joy;

People **May we also come to share in thy heavenly kingdom.**

Priest Almighty God, the fountain of all wisdom, who knowest our necessities before we ask, and our ignorance in asking; we beseech thee to have compassion upon our infirmities; and those things which for our unworthiness we dare not, and for our blindness we cannot ask, vouchsafe to give us for the worthiness of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**




Commemoration of the Dead

Please come forward to receive the Sacrament after the Sanctus bell.

From a statement by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

“Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.”

Communicants at this Mass receive the Sacrament kneeling at the altar rail unless prevented by health. We encourage communicants to consider the example of Masses celebrated by the Holy Father, where the faithful receive the Host directly on the tongue.


